## <u>Meeting of the Special City Council held on Tuesday, August 16, 2016 Pursuant to Notice Duly</u> Given:

1. Meeting called to order by Mayor Heier at 6:00 p.m.

Moved by Schreiber, seconded by D. Reed to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried upon verbal voice vote.

5. Correspondence/Public Input.

Perrizo stated that two bus drivers are needed for the Open Air car show this Saturday and asked for anyone who is interested to contact her.

Wusterbarth gave an update on the roundabouts. The County has a maintenance agreement for them with the State through 2022, but receives no money to do the maintenance. Wusterbarth contacted the DOT and they gave the City approval to take out the rock from the roundabouts, which has become a hazard for motorcyclists and other drivers. For the East roundabout, the upper 16 feet will be shrubs and the remainder will be grass, which will be mowed by the Public Works department. The West roundabout has been maintained in the past by volunteers, so before doing anything to it, Wusterbarth will contact them to find out if the plan to continue that work. If they don't, he will do the same work to it as to the East roundabout.

Schreiber asked about the entrance ramps going onto Highway 41, noting that there are noxious weeds about 30 feet wide next to it. Wusterbarth will contact Pat Scanlan at the County, as this is under their jurisdiction.

Mayor Heier thanked Wusterbarth and his staff for taking on the roundabout project.

- 6. Discussion/Recommendation/Action on the Following:
  - a. Ordinance Creating Sections 8-4-1 Through 8-4-18 Health and Sanitation Wusterbarth wants to make sure all of the information for the City to become its own responsible unit for recycling is sent to the State by the deadline. This ordinance states that we are the responsible unit and Wusterbarth worked with a DNR representative from Madison to put it together. He is hoping to submit everything next week. All of the schools and apartment buildings will also need to be inspected to ensure that they are meeting the recycling requirements and any education needed will also be done. Wusterbarth estimates the cost of this to be \$1,000.

Feldt questioned section 8-4-10 of the ordinance as she thought that all recycling will be going to single-stream. Wusterbarth clarified that we will be going to single-stream and he will put information in the paper and send it out with the annual garbage/recycling

schedule so that people understand how it works. Feld asked how we will be hauling the recyclables. Wusterbarth informed that we will be using the garbage truck. When the truck was purchased, it was thought that we may eventually take over the recycling for the City, so the truck is oversized. Le Breck asked if new containers will be given to residents. Wusterbarth explained that residents will continue to use their own containers as the current truck is not set up with an arm to pick up the bins. This may be a possibility in the future, however, when the next truck is purchased.

Moved by Schreiber, seconded by D. Reed to approve the ordinance creating sections 8-4-1 through 8-4-18 – Health and Sanitation.

Motion carried upon electronically recorded vote.
