Minutes of the Meeting of the Police and Fire Commission Held On Monday, September 17th, 2018 pursuant to notice duly given

4. Approval of Meeting Minutes from 8/20/18.

6. Correspondence

Chief Reed read a thank you card from Bellin Hospital to Cody Henry and Craig Henry for their assistance with the hospital staff on 08/18/18. Chief Rehberg also read a thank you card from Bellin Hospital for the same date for Captain Randy Van Hulle.

7. Discussion/Recommendation/Approval on:

Chief Reed presented equipment costs for a new high expansion foam and distributor. The DNR is requesting all Fire Departments to refrain from using current 3M foam due to possible environmental hazards. The new high expansion foam can fill a basement in 3 minutes, extinguishing the most dangerous kind of structure fire. Chief Reed is requesting the cost of this necessary equipment be deducted from the Capital fund for the total amount of \$5027.14.

Moved by Young, seconded by Watt to authorize purchase of listed fire equipment. 5 ayes Motion carried on verbal voice vote.

Police Department Budget

Chief Rehberg advised that shelving is needed for the evidence room and the garage as current evidence has filled all available space. Training budget for next year will need to increase as there are now 3 new officers and a new detective which requires a considerable amount of training. Capital Equipment will need to increase to \$43,085.30 due to the purchase of a new squad car, outfitting the squad, and new radios.

Moved by Martin, seconded by Groll to approve the Police Department Budget. 5 ayes

Motion carried on verbal voice vote.

Fire Department Budget

Phone budget drops \$500 for 2019. Clothing allowance goes to a set total amount of \$3,500 for the Full Time staff. Capital Equipment budget will be \$40,000 due to the need for a new fire hose, radio maintenance and new OSCBA bottles. Clothing allowance increases due to more Paid on Call members. Ambulance 1013 is 8 years past the recommended replacement date. In an effort to balance out the budget over a ten year period, Ambulance 1013 will be replaced in 2020 and Ambulance 1012 will be replaced in 2021. Ambulances have a 9 year life span, and one will be replaced every 3 years going forward.

Moved by Carriveau, seconded by Martin to approve the Police Department Budget. Motion carried on verbal voice vote.

8. Review/recommendation on Police, Fire, and Rescue reports

Chief Rehberg advised that there were 44 ordinance violations last month and 414 total calls. Members of the Police Department participated in the first day of school breakfast, National Night Out and conducted community CPR training. The Police Department received a donation of rifle grade helmets and vest. Rehberg advised that EMS members will be the next group of individuals to receive the helmets and vests as they go into warm zones during an active incident. Rehberg spoke of the firearms training and 360 Fire Training. Teamwork between multiple agencies was noted from the debriefing of the Sharpe Park Incident. A plan was put in place and executed.

Chief Reed provided an update of the station stating a door is being put up to connect the Fire and Police Department. The Humvee is being outfitted for a cradle point which enables WIFI creating a second command vehicle. The Humvee can be also be used by the Police Department as it can withstand rifle rounds. Reed spoke of the activities his members participated in including National Night Out, station tours and conducting Stop the Bleed training at Oconto Elementary School and Oconto Middle School. The Oconto Fire and Rescue Department along with the Oconto Police Department have been given the task of coordinating the Rescue Task Force. The Oconto County Sheriff's Office transferred \$5,000 and there is a \$30,000 grant available to aid in supplying the vests and helmets to be evenly distributed to EMS members in the county.

Moved by Martin, Seconded by Groll to approve police, fire and rescue reports.
