1. Meeting called to order by Young at 5:58PM.
2. Roll Call: Russ Young, Cliff Martin, Bill Carriveau, Sheri Groll, Joe Watt. Absent: None.
Also present: Chief Rehberg, Chief Reed, and Police Administrative Assistant Dufek as recording secretary.
3. Approval of Agenda
Moved by Watt, seconded by Martin, to approve the agenda. M/C
4. Approval of Meeting Minutes from 10/21/19.
Moved by Carriveau, seconded by Watt, to approve the minutes. 5 ayes

7. Discussion/recommendation/approval on:
 - a. Police Department purchase of five squad car laptops for \$5,000. Purchase would be made by increasing capital.
Moved by Martin, seconded by Watt, to approve purchase. 5 ayes
Motion carried upon verbal voice vote.
 - b. Authorization to request additional bonding of \$70,000 for replacement of SCBA tanks expiring in 2020. Forty tanks are needed, along with one RIT bag.
Moved by Watt, seconded by Groll, to approve request. 5 ayes
Motion carried upon verbal voice vote.
8. Review/recommendation on Police, Fire and Rescue reports
Police:
 - Sixty ordinance violations
 - 440 complaints for October. Chief Rehberg advised we are two months ahead of last year's complaint totals.
 - Community Events
 - Graphics Management conducted an active intruder training. Chief Rehberg and Detective Crocker presented at the training. Chief Rehberg shared it was a good learning experience for the department as well because it brought up ideas to work on.
 - ALICE training was conducted within the schools. Chief Rehberg stated the training really helps teachers and students to experience the reality of an intruder. Detective Crocker played the role of the bad guy.
 - 400 hotdogs were handed out in less than 1.5 hours on Halloween. It was a huge success!
Fire:
 - 2,705 children and 1,181 adults were taught Fire Prevention. This is an increase from last year.
 - Ambulance calls are at 81,744 for the year. This is an increase from last year.
 - The department will be attending training where employees will learn how to care of police dogs.
 - Firefighter VandeVoort received a grant for the purchase of four adult and four infant CPR mannequins.**Moved by Watt, seconded by Martin, to approve Police, and Fire and Rescue reports. 5 ayes**
Motion carried upon verbal voice vote.

9. Review/approval on listings of accounts payables for Police in the amount of \$5,743.15, and Fire and Rescue in the amount of \$8,458.71.
Moved by Groll, seconded by Carriveau, on the approval of accounts payable. 5 ayes
